**OPERATION SMILE MEDICAL MISSION TO TAKE PLACE IN LIMA, PERU FROM  
MAY 22-MAY 31, 2008**

*International Medical Mission Team to Provide Free Surgery to Children Born with Cleft Lips  
and Cleft Palates*

**NORFOLK, VA** – An Operation Smile Medical Mission team will arrive in **Lima, Peru, for an international medical mission taking place May 22-May 31, 2008** to assist children born with facial deformities. The team consists of more than 50 medical and non-medical volunteers from Canada, Colombia, Italy, Nicaragua and the United States who will be working side-by-side with local Peruvian medical volunteers. Founded in 1982, Operation Smile is a worldwide children's medical charity dedicated to helping improve the health and lives of children and young adults.

Lima, Peru

This will be Operation Smile's ninth international medical mission to Lima and the 13<sup>th</sup> medical mission to Peru. Operation Smile will incorporate presentation sessions during the week to provide additional education for plastic surgeons and anesthesiologists. Operation Smile volunteer Dr. Nicola Freda of Italy will give a cleft lip and cleft palate presentation to fellow plastic surgeons, while Dr. Carol Parrot from the United States will give a presentation to anesthesiologists regarding anesthesia for cleft lip and cleft palate repairs. Since 1999, Operation Smile medical volunteers have provided more than 3,700 Peruvian children and young adults with free physical examinations and nearly 2,000 have received life-changing surgery during international medical missions.

The last medical missions in Peru took place in November 2007 during Operation Smile's 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary *World Journey of Smiles*, when two teams of medical and non-medical volunteers

worked together in Arequipa and Trujillo. In total, medical teams conducted free physical examinations for 190 children and young adults and provided surgery to 116 patients suffering with cleft lips, cleft palates and other facial deformities.
